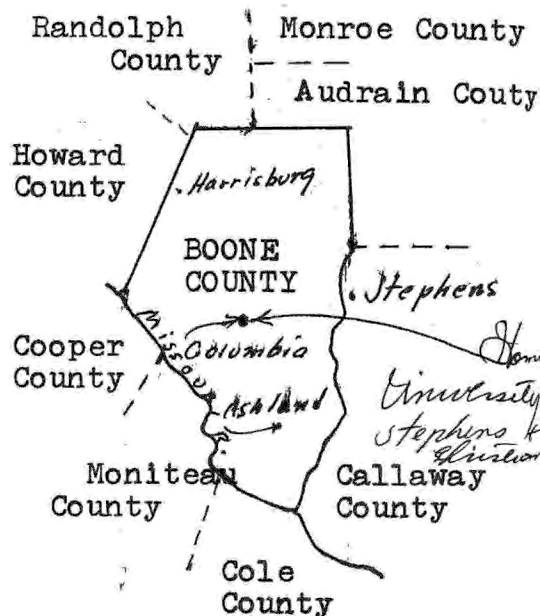


Historic Boone County was named for Daniel Boon. The records are intact at Columbia, the Courthouse. The Missouri Historical Society is in this city with an immense file of old newspapers for research as well as the Western MSS Collection.

The University of Missouri Library has a large collection of books, as has the law library and the libraries and files of Stephens and Christian College, also in the city.

Mrs. E.E. Evans has collected many cemetery trips into record books which help to identify many of the early pioneers. For years she lived at 1511 University Ave., Columbia, Mo., and helped many students in school.

He was b Bonne Co., Mo 3 Sept 1832, s of Benjamin and was a bro of Sanford; James; Thomas; Benjamin Jr; Mrs. J T McBaine; Mrs. W B Hunt; Mrs W T Beazley of Carrollton, Mo., and Sallie Conley. All of his brothers are dead. Three of the sisters survive. Mrs. McBaine has a s, Turner McBaine; Sanford had five chn; Mrs. Beazley two; Mrs Hunt, five, James, two and John was unm. He was a Mason and was bu in Columbia Cem. (Obit was clm and half)

GENTRY, N. has about half-dozen relics, a military commission assigned to his grandfather, RICHARD GENTRY of Kentucky. One of which is for an Ensign, dated 1 Sept 1813 and issued by Gov. Isaac Shelby of Ky. A Lt., commission is signed by Gov. Charles Scott and also that of a Capt., in 1811. He has a silk flag made in 1837 and given to Col Gentry by the ladies of Columbia, Mo., in the Seminole Indian War. The widow of Col. Gentry was named Anne. P 7 C1-3 (abstracted.)

Sir Samuel (Schwabe?) was a noted relative as was Heine, the poet. He came to the United States at the age of 16 years and in 1839 he m MARY ELIZABETH SANDKER in St. Charles, Missouri.
